### Statement of Purpose

On <u>February 5, 2013</u>, the Monterey County Board of Supervisor's approved the Monterey County Workforce Investment Board's (WIB) recommendation to create a standing Business Services Committee that focuses on services to and for employers, including training of incumbent workers, new hires and potential hires that meet the workforce needs of high demand sectors by preparing skilled workers for employment in competitive and emergent industry sectors that support job retention and job growth.

In accordance with the WIB bylaws, approved on <u>February 5, 2013</u>, the Business Services Committee shall be established and composed of WIB members as directed by the WIB Chair.

Responsibilities of the Business Services Committee shall include:

- 1. Develop and make recommendations for the Business Service Plan to the Board of Supervisors in an effort to increase employer involvement in the activities of our local board;
- 2. Submit the Business Services Plan along with the local Strategic Plan to the State of California Workforce Investment Board (CWIB);
- 3. Conduct Labor Market Intelligence (LMI) Analysis;
- 4. Provide oversight of Rapid Response Program services:
- 5. Champion the Career Readiness Certificate WorkKeys and Worldwide Interactive Network (WIN); and
- 6. Report back to the full WIB on issues as directed by the full WIB on a bi-annual basis.

Additional objectives of the Business Service Committee shall include:

- Ensure the Business Services Plan integrates local business involvement with workforce initiatives;
- Partner effectively with businesses to identify and resolve skill gaps in priority industry sectors;
- Explore market penetration (% of businesses that are aware of our services vs. total businesses in the community);
- Analyze number of Job Openings posted in the Virtual One Stop (VOS) system;
- Review length of time it takes referrals to be made to available job openings;
- Conduct presentations to employers design an effective outreach strategy and consistent messaging to effectively communicate what the WIB can do to help business (Strategic Plan);
- Review and evaluate new customers new subscribers to VOS system/business services team tracking;
- Review and evaluate repeat Customers repeat business usage tracking;
- Conduct LMI analysis (participate in Chamber surveys) and evaluation of surveys/impacts gained (Strategic Plan); and
- Bring recognition to employers of job screening and referral services that our One-Stops and program operators provide.

### **INFORMATION:**

A representative from the Monterey County Business Council will give a presentation on the Career Readiness Certificate at the Business Services Committee meeting on February 12, 2013.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Monterey County Business Council and MCBERI developed a Central Coast Career Readiness Consortium aimed at utilizing the Career Readiness Certificate Program to certify worker skills. At present, the consortium is comprised of businesses, government agencies, educational entities and not-for-profits to include the Workforce Investment Board and One Stop Career Centers.

The Career Readiness Certification includes comprehensive assessments and remedial training.

- Assessment: The Business Council has negotiated an exclusive arrangement with WorkKeys, to provide the comprehensive assessments used for measuring, communicating and improving the common real-world skills required for success in the workplace. The assessment testing focuses on three skills: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information and Locating Information. These three skills are needed in 85% of all jobs to be successful for entry-level employment, job retention and promotions.
- Training: The Business Council has also negotiated an exclusive agreement with the Worldwide Interactive Network (WIN) to provide skill-based remedial training to improve worker skills. Online instruction is available for Customer Service, Business Writing, Teamwork, Listening, Work Habits (Soft Skills) and many others.

### **INFORMATION:**

WIB staff plan to present an update on the California's Strategic Workforce Development Plan for 2012 – 2017 and the development of a business services plan which integrates local business involvement with workforce initiatives.

The new Strategic Workforce Development Plan serves as a framework for public policy, fiscal investment, and workforce training programs for use by local WIBs for the development, planning efforts, and submission of their new five-year Local Plans.

Local WIBs are required to comply with the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Section 118, which requires their plans to be consistent with the State's plan on the realignment of workforce programs with a strong emphasis on regional partnerships and integrated service delivery systems.

Local WIB's are also encouraged to develop a common workforce accountability system. This includes a new bi-annual certification process of mandated requirements, beyond what has been required in previous Local Plans. It also requires the development of a standing Business Services Committee and business services plan.

To assist local WIB's, the State intends to provide technical assistance meetings to Local WIB administrators and staff responsible for developing their respective Local Plans. Monterey County WIB staff is planning to attend a technical assistance meeting scheduled for Friday, February 8, 2013. Updates from this meeting will be presented at the Business Services Committee meeting on February 12, 2013.

### **December 2012 Unemployment Stats**

- The unemployment rate in Monterey County is 13.1% in December 2012, up from a revised 9.5% in November 2012, and below the year-ago estimate of 14.4%.
- The number of unemployed is 29,100, up 6,900 from 22,200 in November 2012 and down 2,200 compared to December 2011.
- Seven cities throughout Monterey County had unemployment rates less than 8%; and five cities had rates between 16 24%.
- The City of Gonzales' unemployment rate of 24.4% is the highest in the County, followed by King City at 21.5%, Greenfield at 20.1% and Salinas at 18.2%. Of the unincorporated areas of the County, Chular's unemployment rate is 32.2%, followed by San Ardo at 29%, Moss Landing at 28%, Las Lomas at 27.1%, San Lucas at 26% and Castroville at 24.2%. ### Methodology:

### **Data Not Seasonally Adjusted**

Labor Employ- Unemployment Census Ratios

Monthly city and CDP labor force data are derived by multiplying current estimates of county employment and unemployment by the employment and unemployment shares (ratios) of each city and CDP at the time of the 2000 Census. Ratios for cities of 25,000 or more persons were developed from special tabulations based on household population only from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. For smaller cities and CDP, ratios were calculated from published census data.

City and CDP unrounded employment and unemployment are summed to get the labor force. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployment by the labor force. Then the labor force, employment, and unemployment are rounded.

This method assumes that the rates of change in employment and unemployment, since 2000, are exactly the same in each city and CDP as at the county level (i.e., that the shares are still accurate). If this assumption is not true for a specific city or CDP, then the estimates for that area may not represent the current economic conditions. Since this assumption is untested, caution should be employed when using these data.
